The perfect walk for exploring the

wild southern end of the Haweswater valley, which is properly known as Mardale. From the picturesque wooded promontory of The Rigg, our route climbs the stunning ridge of Rough Crag, all the way up to the summit of High Street, then descends over the parallel ridge of Kidsty Pike. Keep your eyes open for England's last golden eagle, who nests high among these sharply-defined ridges. The views over Blea Water and Haweswater are sensational.

Start

At the far end of car park,

go through gate and follow path. Turn almost immediate R by the wall, following sign 'Fellside path to Bampton'. Path heads downhill with wall R. Go through gate and veer R to join lakeshore. Continue gently uphill on path (wall R). After 400 yards a shortcut appears L, but it is steep and we recommend continuing ahead to crest of The Rigg for views down Haweswater.

21.2km/¾ mile

At The Rigg (pines R),
go through gap in wall then
turn L onto path heading
uphill to ridge. Climb steadily,
going L through gap in wall.
Path veers R up a scree bank.
Path now climbs steadily with
wall R, until wall veers away





3.6km/2¼ miles
Continue along the ridge
to steeper ground at the top
end (Long Stile), where it joins
on to High Street (there are
some scrambling steps here).
On gaining skyline, veer L
and make for the trig point
at High Street summit.

DON'T MISS...



It's more a case of 'you'll be lucky to

spot...', but Lonesome George, England's only resident Golden Eagle, patrols these Cumbrian skies.

4.7km/3 miles

(north) and follow wall-line for 1.3km/0.8 miles (this stretch is marked Straights of Riggindale on OS maps). At clear junction of paths, turn R away from wall, heading north-west above Riggindale. Continue on path, climbing sharply to reach cairn on summit of Kidsty Pike.

7km/4½ miles
Follow the ridgeline downhill. Approaching Kidsty Howes, ignore path branching L and continue on the main path, keeping Haweswater in view ahead. Descend grassy slope, eventually reaching a crossing track at bottom.

9.5km/6 milesTurn R on track, cross the footbridge and pass through trees, climbing towards The Rigg. Pass the point where you branched off at Point 2, and retrace earlier steps along shoreline



back to the car park. W
