CHOSEN BY... NICK HALLISSEY Day 1 of a terrific two-day circular

route starts at one iconic Lake District inn and takes you over the hills to another one. The walk is high-level from the start, crossing St Raven's Edge, Stony Cove Pike and Thornthwaite Crag, and descending over Gray Crag with a fabulous view of High Street and Hayeswater across the way. It finishes at the superb Brotherswater Inn, which offers a great view of the return route that lies ahead on Day 2.

Start 7

From car park, cross road and take footpath leading

uphill to L of Kirkstone Inn signed for St Raven's Edge. Go through gate and climb hillside, passing wind turbines and making for wall-line ahead. Go through another gate and follow path up steep flank of hill. At top, reach cairn and follow St Raven's Edge north with wall L. Follow path beside wall-line, climbing to a monumenton Caudale Moor. Here stay on main path (ignoring branching path L) and continue, tending R. to summit cairn on Stony Cove Pike.

3.1km/2 miles

Continue east and begin steep, rocky descent into Threshthwaite Mouth (some down-climbing required).


Start/parking: Car park opposite Kirkstone Pass Inn, grid ref NY401081. Is it for me? A linear walk on high mountain paths, occasionally indistinct. Steep, rocky descent off Stony Cove Pike to Threshthwaite Mouth – beware in poor conditions Stiles None

Nearest town Ambleside Refreshments Kirkstone Pass Inn at start, Brotherswater Inn at end Public toilets None Public transport None in winter. Buses 108 and 508 connect Glenridding and Windermere via Kirkstone Pass in spring, summer and early autumn. Maps Ordnance Survey Explorer OL7 & OL5.

Follow wall line L and begin ascent up far side of gap,



tending R. Climb is steep but soon levels out to reach top of Thornthwaite Crag marked by enormous obelisk-cairn

4.7km/3 miles Go through wall. Do not take main path which continues to High Street, but turn L. loosely following wall-line. Path tends directly north above Haveswater (High Street is the large fell opposite), continuing for a further mile to the small summit cairn of Gray Crag.

6.5km/4 miles Continue ahead, dropping directly off the 'nose' of Grav Crag. Path is steep but clear. Nearing bottom, path veers R then L to join clear path coming down from Haveswater. Join this path and continue through gates. At double-gates near sheep-pens take R of two paths and follow stonier track towards Hartson, Track becomes metalled as it enters village.

8.9km/5½ miles Take first footpath L.





signed for Low Beckside. Head down track between two barns. Cross footbridge over river. Path continues ahead, passing house L. Turn R with crossing track. At private driveway, track yeers R of drive to become enclosed sunken path. Follow through gate. emerging onto main road.

9.6km/6 miles

Carefully cross road and go through kissing-gate opposite to turn L on permissive path following shoreline of Brothers Water. After end of lake, path

climbs gradually to join access track to Sykeside Campsite. Turn R on track to reach car park of Brotherswater Inn. End of Day 1. W
