# 15 CUMBRIA LOUGHRIGG FELL & RYDAL CAVE

Distance: 3½ miles/5.2km Time: 2 hours Grade: Moderate

Wainwright, this is a good place to start. In a couple of hours you'll walk through bluebell woods alongside the clear, burbling River Rothay, and along Loughrigg Terrace, overlooking Grasmere, Then a short climb, with a steep section you can call a scramble if you want to impress the folks at home. leads to the summit trigpoint. Here, postcard views of some of Lakeland's finest and most famous fells are sure to inspire future adventures. Then, in case anyone's getting bored, there's the promise of Rvdal Cave on the descent. In fact

a disused slate quarry surrounded by Scots Pines, the cave has a flooded entrance across which stepping stones lead to the dry. cavernous and very echoey interior.

#### Start

From White Moss Car Park head south to the River Rothay and then R. upstream. to a footbridge, signed Rydal Cave. Cross the bridge, go ahead through woods towards Loughrigg Terrace. Where path leaves woods go R, signed Grasmere, to a rise, Fork L. SW. along Loughrigg Terrace: don't drop down to Grasmere shore. Continue 600m



L and climb Loughrigg's NW ridge to the summit. The LDNP authority are paving the steepest sections: where the gradient slackens the summit trig point appears and the paving disappears.

Continue E from the summit, dropping down past a cairn to a fork. Go L, NE, down stone steps, curve E past two cairns. At third cairn go L, E: skirt S of a small tarn. Continue E down a small valley towards the marsh of Scartufts. Contour S around the marsh, keeping L at 3 forks. Once heading N, tree-clad slopes of Nab Scar appear ahead. Continue N: Rydal Water appears. Drop down to a rock outcrop by pine trees, then skirt L to reach Rydal Cave.

42<sup>4</sup> miles/3.6km Head W, soon dropping NW to a broad track near Rydal Water shore. At wood corner by ruined barn rejoin outward route, go L, signed Grasmere. Through woods, across footbridge, R, signed Ambleside via Coffin Route to return to car park.
