This walk starts from the attractive village of North Newbald, nestling at the foot of the Yorkshire Wolds. Country lanes and footpaths make for easy walking via the estate village of Hotham and on to North Cave. The minor road into Drewton Dale leads to a steady climb on to the Wolds. *By Arnold Underwood.*

1 Start

From village green walk past two pubs and round corner by church continuing into South Newbald. Follow road round to R to junction with A1034. Cross over and walk along minor road into Hotham. As you approach church you can cut L through churchyard for a closer look and emerge on main street. Head through village to war memorial at junction near Hotham Arms.

2 2.5km/1½ miles

Continue south from memorial

and look for a footpath at bend in road. This path crosses meadows. Go over another minor road and pass Home Farm to enter park of Hotham Hall. Footpath follows edge of parkland and brings you out in North Cave. Here turn L and walk round corner, passing gatehouse to Hotham Hall, then past lake to church of All Saint's at junction with B1230.

3 4.8km/3 miles

Turn L out of Church Lane and walk alongside B1230, crossing over. Walk along verge towards field gate at corner. Go into field and maintain direction along edge of two fields to meet green lane. Go R then immediately L to continue along side of two more fields to another green lane. Here, go R for about 200m then L along footpath across fields to Drewton Farm. Go past buildings on to farm lane down to A1034. Go R until opposite Drewton

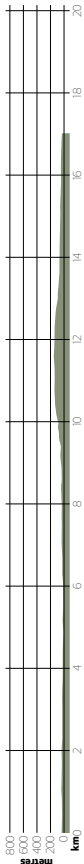

turn, then cross over. Walk along lane passing cottages and Drewton Manor.

4 6km/3¾ miles

Ignore first footpath L and continue into Drewton Dale. Take L fork and follow lane round over Drewton Beck by a pond and up hill towards Diamond Cottage. Go through gate beyond building and take track that heads diagonally up slope of Drewton Wold. Continue through gate and head onwards and upwards above wooded slopes of Austin's Dale. At top you emerge from trees. Map shows a path cutting

across field to L, but it's easier to keep to track which loops round a copse before heading to B1230. Here, go R along verge for about 500m to meet with Wolds Way and there cross over and walk for further 100m. Turn L following WW across a field and then R along lane to crossroads near North Plantation.

5 9.6km/6 miles

Cross over Newbald road and continue along lane for about 200m, then go L down side of a field. Follow field edge round to stile and down into a dale. Turn L and continue on Wolds Way

down full length of Swin Dale (about 2.5km). Initially going is on field paths but further down it is a farm track that brings you to minor road from Beverley. Here, turn L and walk down into North Newbald, passing area of springs now protected as nature reserve. The final section is particularly attractive. **walking**
